**factory** - a building where goods are manufactured by machines.

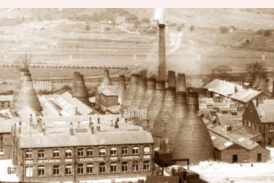
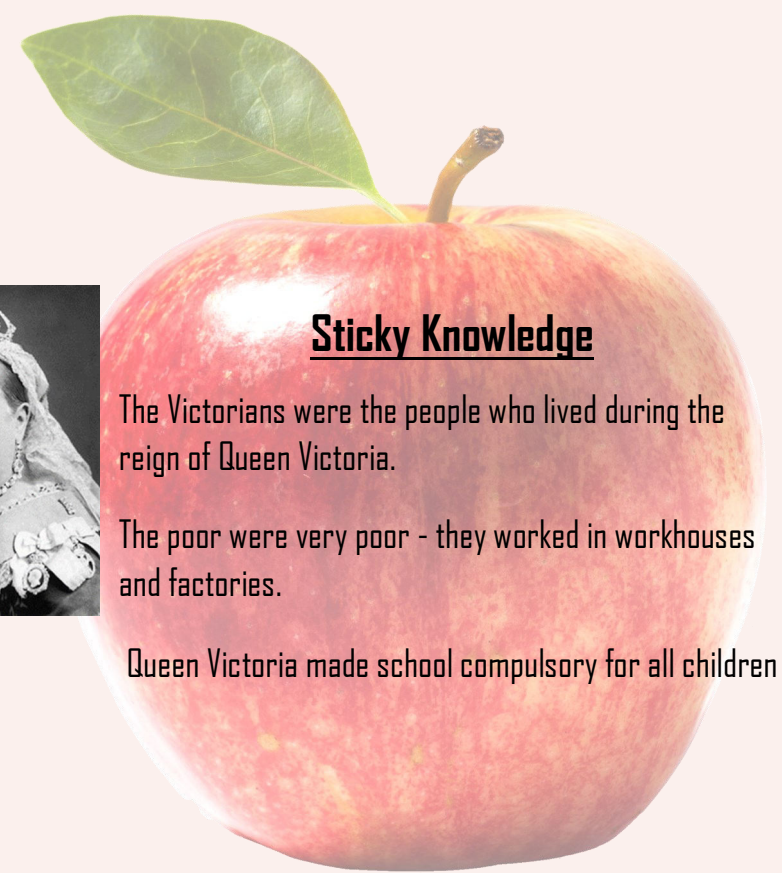

## Why does Easter matter to Christians?

**Easter**-festival celebrated by people of the Christian faith, recognizing Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection from the dead.

**Resurrection**-how Jesus rose from the dead.

**Incarnation**-God in human form (how Jesus was born)

**Gospel**-good news

**Salvation**- how Jesus died for the sins of God's people

**Good Friday**-Christians around the world mourn and reflect on the day that Jesus Christ was crucified.

**Palm Sunday**-the Sunday before Easter Sunday when Jesus rode a donkey into Jerusalem.

**Big story of the Bible**- the purpose for which the Bible was written. Each of its sixty-six books contributes to telling this Big Story—a story of creation, fall, redemption, and restoration.



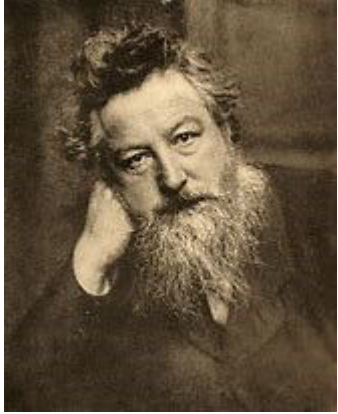
## Year 2

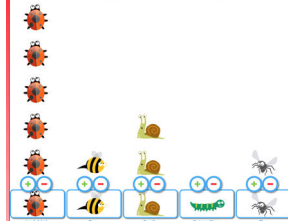

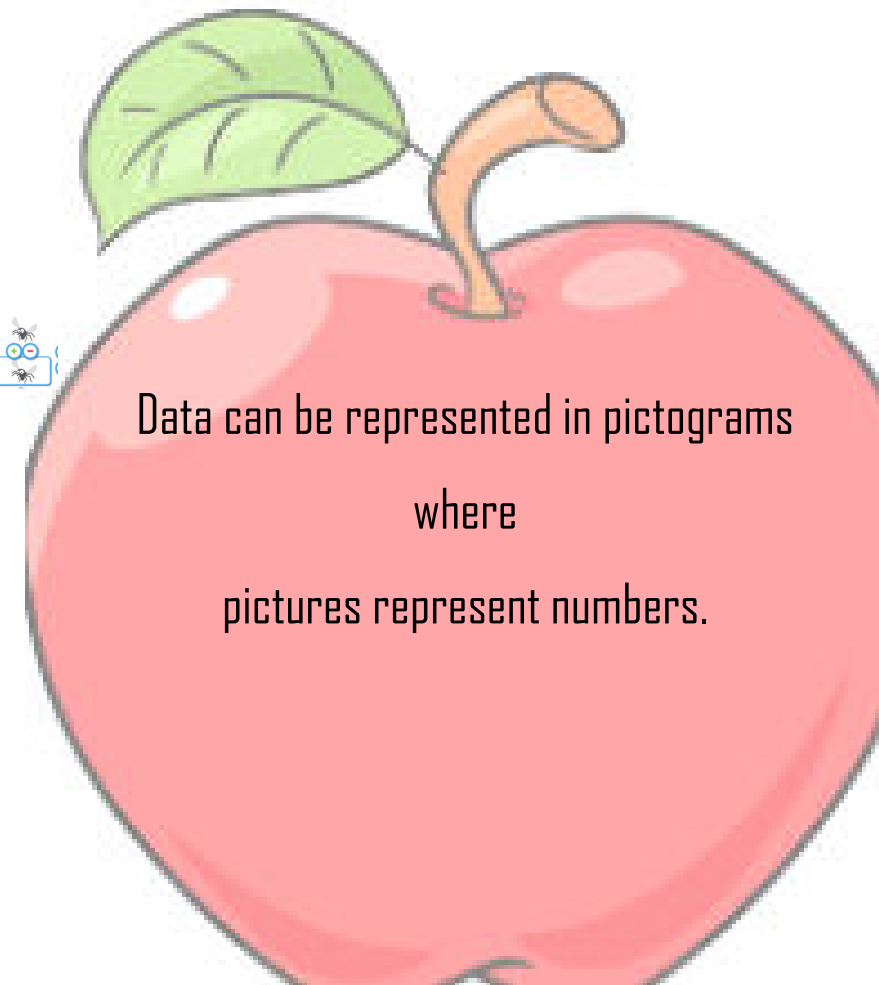

## Mechanisms

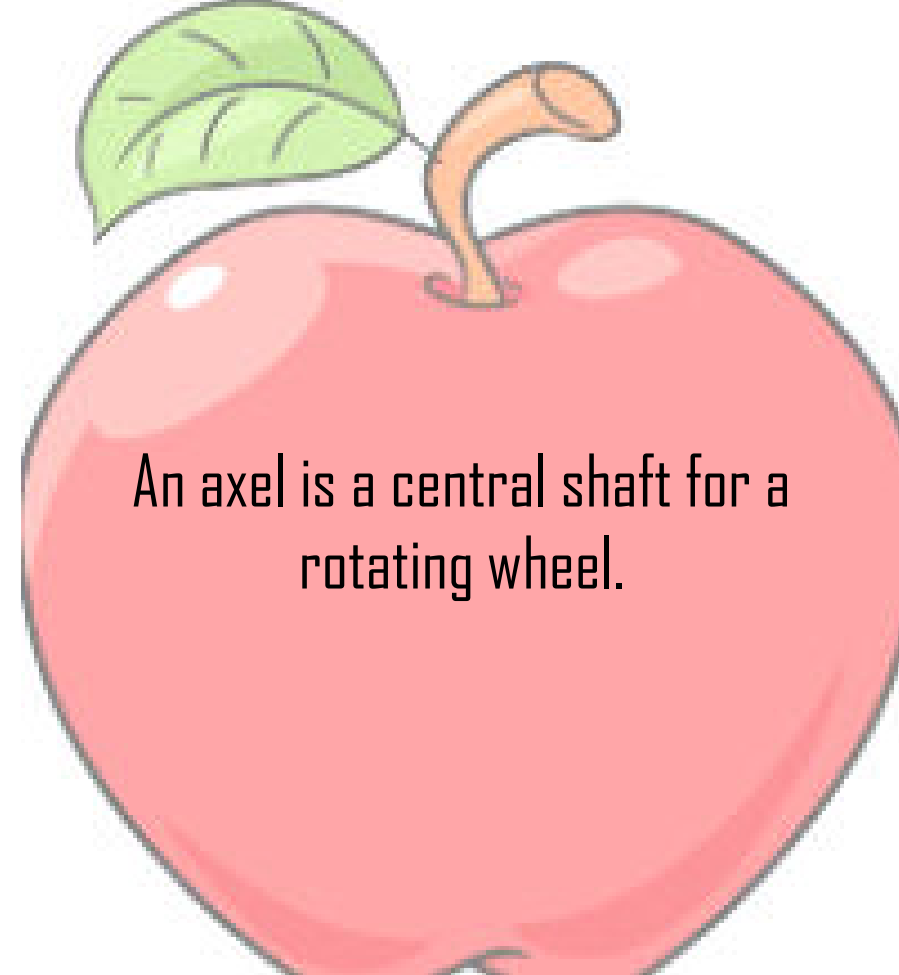
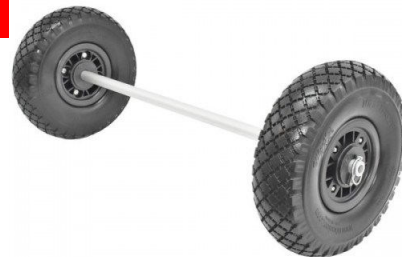
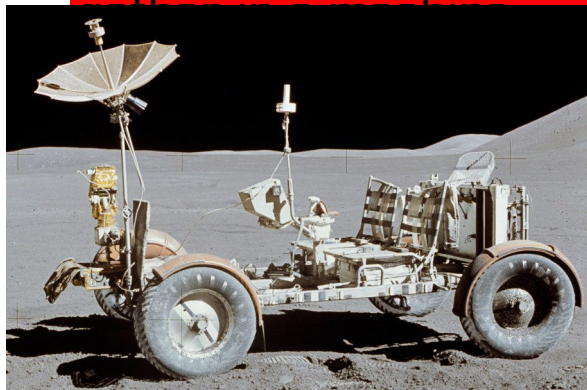
wheel

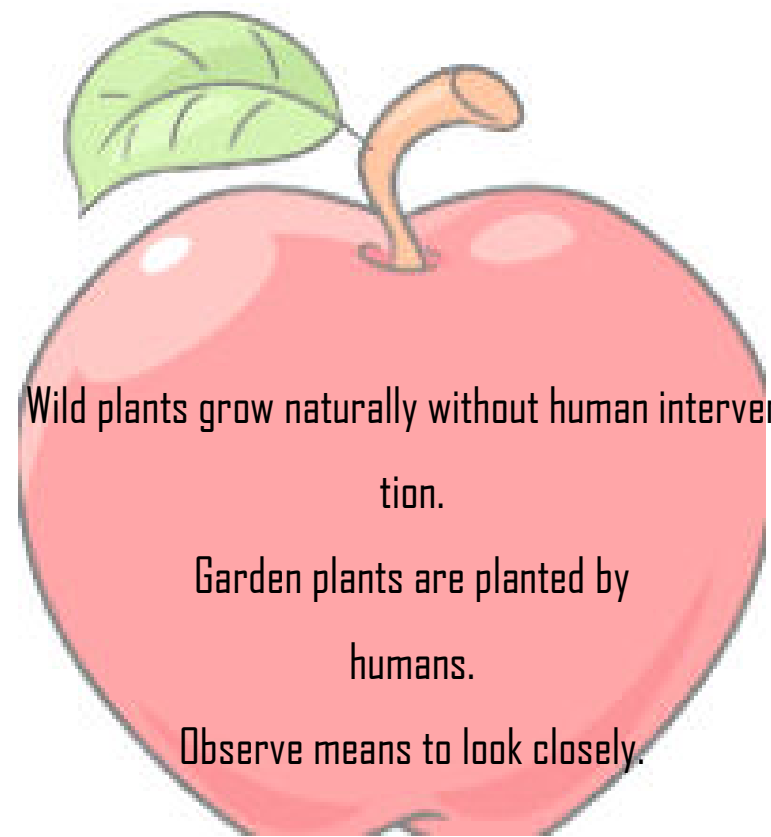
