Why does Easter matter to Christians?

God & Believing

Easter-festival celebrated by people of the Christian faith, recognizing Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection from the dead.

Resurrection-how Jesus rose from the dead.

Incarnation-God in human form (how Jesus was born)

Gospel-good news

Salvation- how Jesus died for the sins of God's people

Good Friday-Christians around the world mourn and reflect on the day that Jesus Christ was crucified.

Palm Sunday-the Sunday before Easter Sunday when Jesus rode a donkey into Jerusalem.

Big story of the Bible- the purpose for which the Bible was written. Each of its sixty-six books contributes to telling this Big Story—**a story of creation, fall, redemption, and restoration**.



Easter is important in the 'Big story' of the Bibleus Jesus showed that he was willing to forgive all people, even for putting him on the cross.

Christians believe Jesus builds a bridge between God and humans. Christians believe Jesus rose again, giving people hope of a new life.
