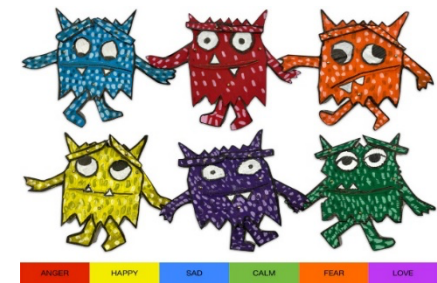
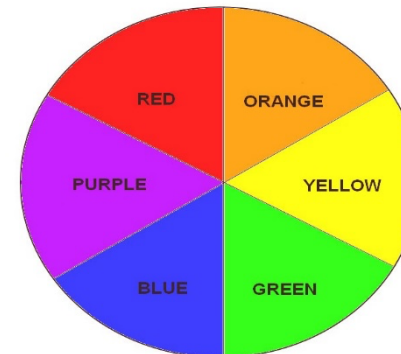


Art – Colour and Emotions

Emotions	Are what people feel and can be seen in all mammals.
Primary colours	Red, Blue and yellow. They can be mixed in different ways to make every other colour.
Secondary colours	Colours made by mixing two primary colours together.
Lighter	To make a colour paler by adding white.
Darker	To make a colour have a deeper tone by adding black.
Image	A painting, drawing or photograph.
Tone	The lightness or darkness of a colour or shade.



Sticky Knowledge

How can I show tone in my art?

Black, white and grey can be added to paint to make different colours to show light and dark. If you are using pencil or charcoal, you can press harder to create a darker tone.

What are the secondary colours?

Red and yellow = orange

Red and blue = purple

Blue and yellow = green

Paint	The art of creating a picture using colours, tones, shapes, lines and textures.
Freehand	Drawn without using instruments such as a ruler.
Technology	The use of knowledge to invent new devices or tools.

Purpose	The reason for which something exists or is done/made.
Effectiveness	The ability to be successful and produce the intended results.
Software	A series of instructions that tells a computer what to do, ie the code.

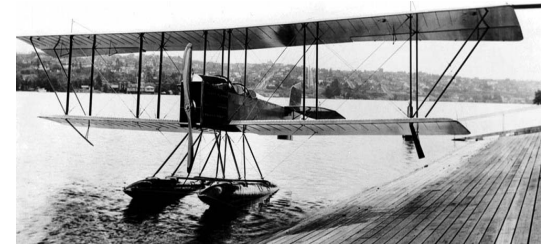

Before their invention, people could only travel by water or land. The Wright brothers changed this with their flying machine and made travel around the world easier and quicker.



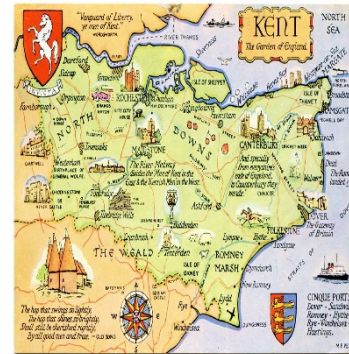

Geography - Mapwork

Aerial image	A picture of something from above looking down.
Locational language	Direction words e.g. Near, far, left, right.
Postional language	Words that describe the postion of people or objects.
Birds-eye view	To look down on something, as a bird flying would see it.
Forwards	To move towards the direction in front
Backwards	To move in the opposite direction to the one you are facing.
Map	A drawing or picture to show where things are.

Did the plot succeed?

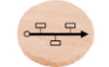

Music – Christmas Carols

Follow	Reading music notes or lyrics whilst they are being played or sung.
Chorus	Part of a song that is repeated several times.
Carol	A religious song sung at Christmas.
Verse	The main part of the song which tell the story.
Direction	Instructions on how to play a piece of music.
Note	A small bit of sound, like a syllable in language.

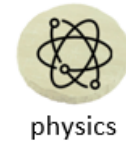
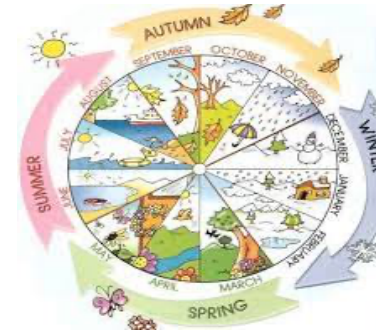
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Science – Seasonal changes

Moon	A large natural object that travels around the Earth.
Sun	A hot ball of gases that is a star. It gives us light and heat on earth.
Observe	To watch/listen to something carefully.
Daylight hours	The length of time between sunrise and sunset (sun goes up, sun goes down).
Season	Four different times during the year with different types of weather.
Spherical	Something round in 3D.

What are the seasons?

There are four seasons, Spring, Summer, Autumn, and Winter.

How does the sun affect night and day?

Once every 24 hours, the Earth turns.

When we are on the side that is facing the Sun, we have daylight.

When we are moved to the side facing away from the sun, we have night-time.
