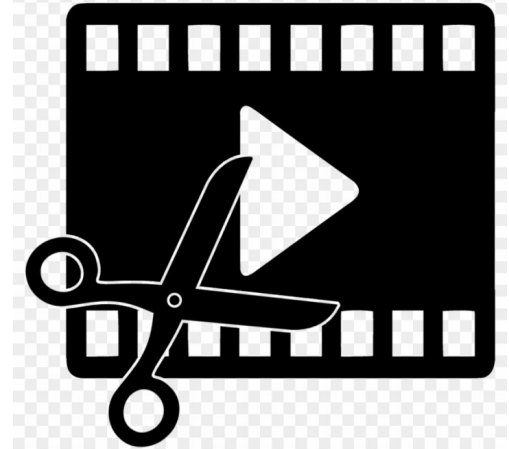

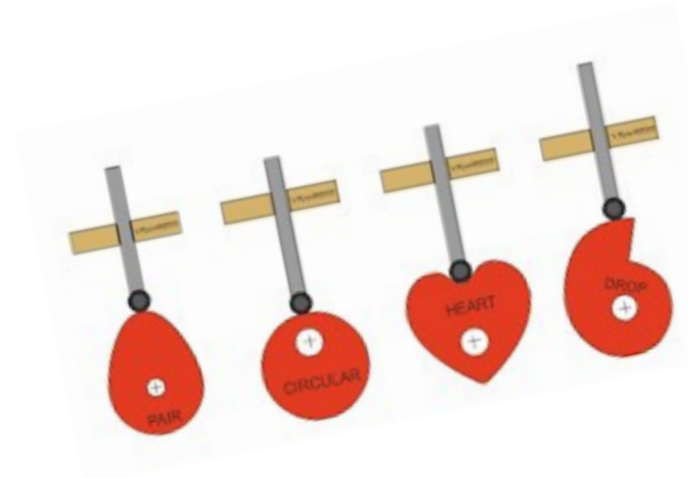

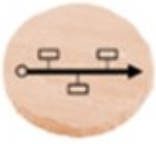

rescuer

Person who saves someone from a dangerous or difficult situation.

prophecy

The prediction of future events.

saviour

One who delivers from danger. A rescuer.

transfiguration

Complete change of form or appearance

Christians see Jesus as their Saviour.

The Old Testament talks about a 'rescuer' or 'anointed one'.
