Computing – Moving a robot

Robot	A machine capable of carrying out a series of actions automatically.
Programme	An order of events.
Command	An instruction causing a robot to perform one of its basic functions.
Direction	A course along which someone or something moves.
Predict	To say something will happen.
Sequence	A particular order in which things will happen.
Code	A series of instructions that tells the robot what to do.



Sticky Knowledge

- Predict an outcome of a command on a device
- Run a command to move a robot forward and backwards.
- Give and follow directions
- Start a sequence from the same place

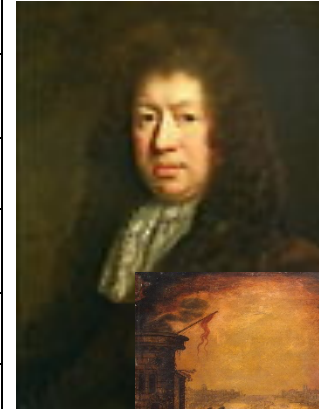

History – The Great Fire of London

London	The capital city of England, where the Great Fire took place.
Timeline	A chronological arrangement of events in the order that they happened.
Evidence	The facts or information indicating whether a belief is true.
Artefact	An object made by a human being, typically one of cultural or historical interest.
Samuel Pepys	An historian who wrote a diary which covered the Fire of London.
Online sources	Web pages and documents online that provide information.

Science – Animals

Amphibians	Amphibians live in the water as babies and on land as they grow older. They have smooth, slimy skin.
Reptiles	All reptiles breathe air. They have scales on their skin.
Mammals	Mammals are animals that breathe air, grow hair or fur and feed on their mother's milk as a baby.
Birds	All birds have a beak, two legs, feathers and wings.
Fish	Fish live and breathe under water. They have scaly skin, fins to help them swim and they breathe through gills.
Invertebrates	Creatures with no back bone. Often found to be INSECTS.
Carnivore	Animals that mostly eat other animals (meat) are carnivores.
Herbivore	Animals that only eat plants are herbivores.
Omnivore	Animals that eat both plants and other animals are omnivores.



Sticky Knowledge:

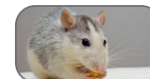
A dolphin and a whale are mammals because they give birth to their babies and come up for air from the ocean.

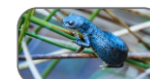
