
Eardrum

A part of the ear which is a thin, tough layer of tissue **Soundwave** Make the eardrum vibrate Vibrations A quick movement back and forth **Soundproof** To prevent sound from passing through **Amplitude** The size of a vibration A larger amplitude = a louder
