## Horton Kirby - Year 4

On Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> May Year 4 had a whale of a time on their class trip when they visited the Education Centre at Horton Kirby.

They learnt how to classify plants, animals, birds and insects by carefully considering if they are vascular or non-vascular plants and vertebrates or invertebrates. They then did some pond dipping where we caught some newts, snails and even a dragonfly larvae, used binoculars to spot and identify birds, used microscopes to see the different parts of plants up close and even found time to hunt some insects so we could identify which ones called the woodlands their habitat.
