




Year 1 Term 1 – Home Learning

Please aim to complete one task a week. The choice is yours! Try and choose a variation of activities. Once you have completed a task, either post it on google classroom or bring it in to show your teacher and classmates. Most importantly...have fun!

- 1) Make a display of the four seasons. This can be created in any way you prefer e.g. a collage, shoebox, Play-Doh.
- 2) Make your own paper aeroplane, decorating it just how you would like your aeroplane to look! How far can you fly your plane?
 - 3) Go for a woodland/park walk. Take photos of what you notice. Can you go for a walk in September and then go again in October? Compare the photos. What changes do you notice?
 - 4) Black History Month runs between 1st-31st October. Can you research and create a fact file on a black historical figure? Some historical figures to research: Rosa Parks, Nelson Mandela.
 - 5) Go for a nature walk and collect as many natural objects as you can e.g. leaves, stones, conkers, sticks. Now sort them out into sets (groups). Can you count how many objects are in each set?
 - 6) Complete the oceans and continents jigsaw. Find this attached on google classroom.
 - 7) Can you create a fact file on your favourite sea creature. What oceans do they live in?
 - 8) Create a collage using objects you have collected on a nature walk (you may want to complete this after completing number 5). Can the class guess what your collage is a picture of?

Solve the clues to find out who they belong to!













Continents and Oceans Jigsaw
