Year 6 Remembrance Worship –Monday 11th November 2024

Year 6 will be leading our Remembrance Worship in school. This will take place at 9.15am. We invite all year 6 parents to join the whole school in sharing in with this remembrance time.

Poppies and other products will be sold daily from Monday 4th November. Please ensure you have some money to donate for these purchases.



Attendance

If your child is absent from school, please telephone and speak with the office before 9.00am. If we do not receive a reason for absence on the morning, then this will be recorded as unauthorised.

The Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance changed from 19th August 2024, With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices issued by DfE, the following changes have come into force for School Penalty Notice Fines.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period. These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child paid with 28 days. Reduced to £80 per child, per child if paid within 21 days, Per Parent, Per Child Penalty notices are issued per parent for each child that was absent.

Second Offence (within 3 years)

The Second time a penalty notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be: £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days. No discount will be offered.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case could be presented straight to a magistrates court. Prosecution can result in a criminal record/s and fines of up to £2500. The attendance policy can be found on the

school's website.



Morning drop off / Lateness

Morning drop off, the gates close promptly at 8.55am, once this happens you will need to press the buzzer at the main gate. From 8.55am - 9am your child must go through the school office to their classrooms to ensure they are not late, no parents are able to walk their child to their classroom.

If your child arrives after 9am they are late, persistant lateness also contributes to a loss in a child's education.

So please ensure you are getting your children to school promptly.


