materials	The name of what something is made from.
texture	The feeling and appearance of a surface.
media	The materials and tools used to create artwork.
collage	Art that is created using different materials and textures.



Sticky knowledge:



- A collage can be created by tearing and overlapping.
- Collage is an art form created by sticking different materials together to make a new artwork.

How to Hold a Pair of Scissors



1. Put your thumb through the small scissor handle.
2. Put your last three fingers through the larger handle.
3. Hold the paper you are cutting in your other hand.

Computing – Digital Writing

computer	A device that stores, finds, and processes data.
toolbar	The buttons at the top of the screen that allow you to make changes.
shift	The shift key changes the output of a key.
output	Any information processed by and sent from a computer or electronic device.

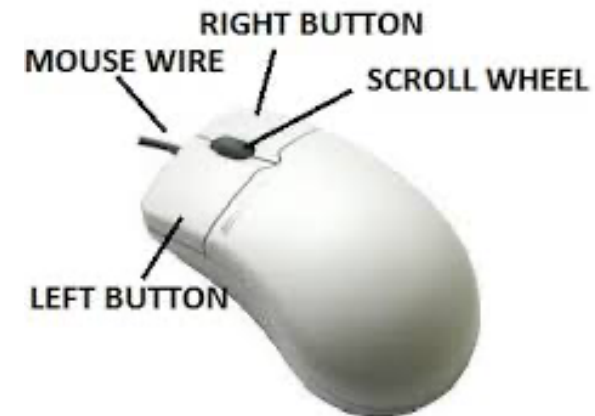


Sticky knowledge:

The keys on a keyboard help you to type and edit text.

The mouse can be used to enter and edit text.

The appearance of text is called the font. This can be changed.

DT – Portable Snacks



snack	Something that is eaten in between meals, something usually small.
prepare	To get something ready or made.
ingredients	The different parts you need to make something.
portable	Something that can be moved easily.



Sticky Knowledge

A portable snack is small, easy to transport and can be eaten without plates and cutlery.

To cut, spread, scoop and shape are food preparation skills needed to make a snack.

Geography – Seasons and Weather

Equator	An imaginary line that goes around the middle of the Earth, dividing it into the Northern part and the Southern part.
North Pole	The northernmost point on Earth, located at the top of the world in the Arctic Ocean.
South Pole	The southernmost point on Earth, located at the bottom of the planet.
climate	The average weather conditions in an area.
map	A drawing or picture to show where things are.

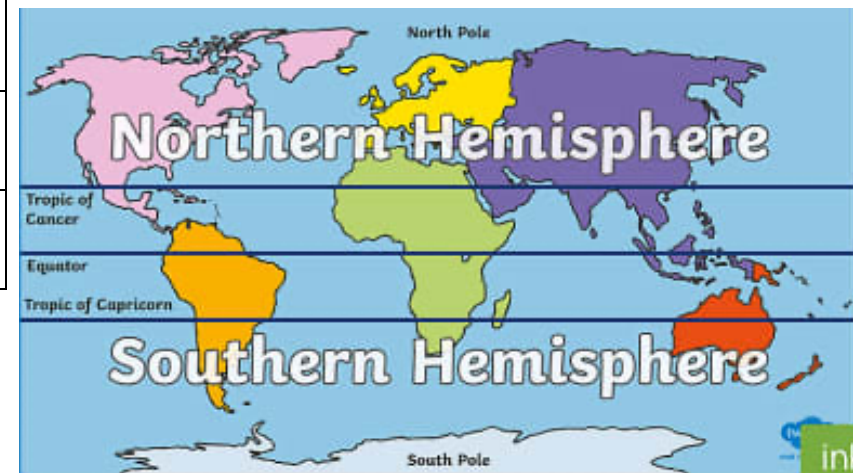


Sticky knowledge:

The South Pole is a lot colder than the North Pole.



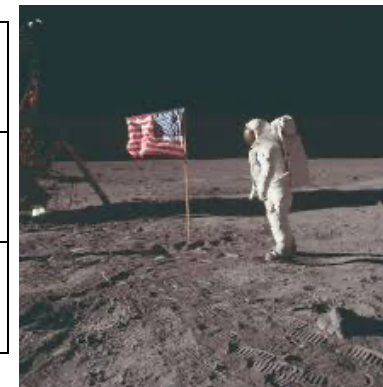

History – The Moon Landing

Moon landing	The first ever landing on the Moon.
mission	An important job or task giving to someone.
Apollo 11	The historic space mission that first landed humans on the Moon



Sticky knowledge:



The first moon landing was on July 20th 1969 as part of the Apollo 11 mission.

This was a significant moment in history because it was the first time a human had landed on the moon.

The US won the space race against Russia.

Music – Untuned Instruments

instrument	Something used to create sound.
untuned	An instrument that has no change in pitch.
graphic notation	A symbol and visual used to represent sound.

Sticky Knowledge:



Untuned instruments make a sound but with no change in pitch.

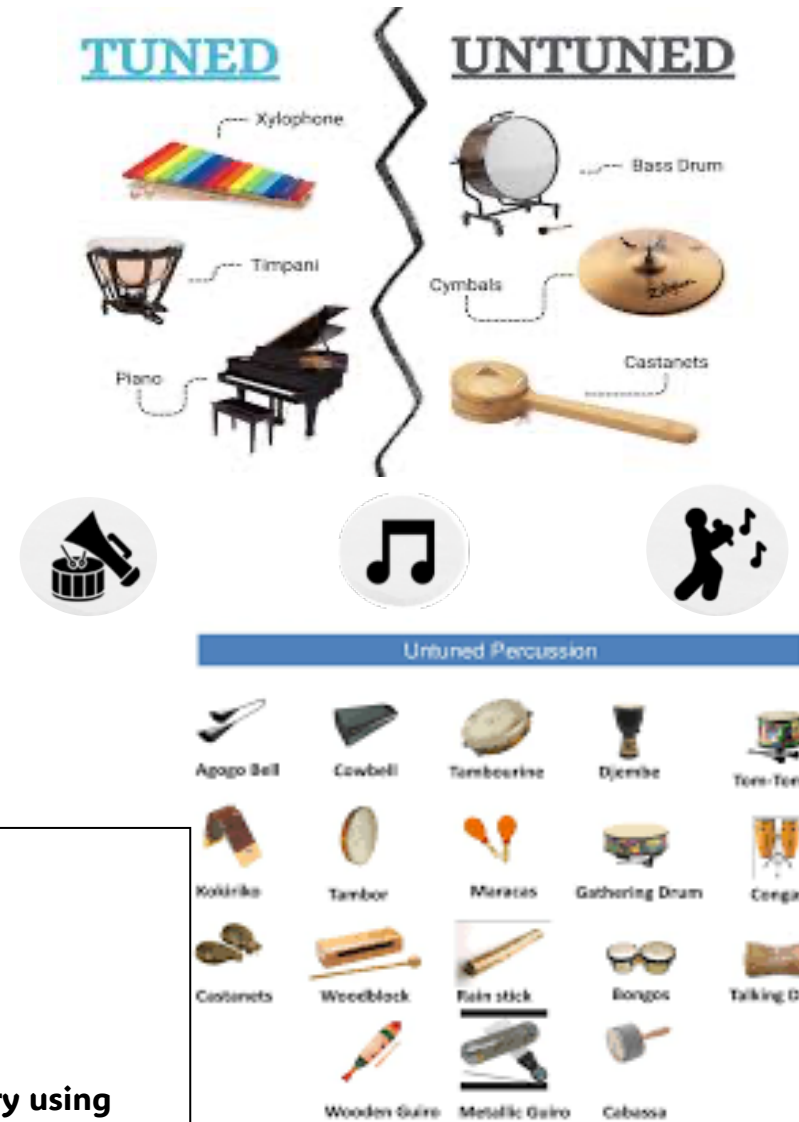
You can write music using pictures and signs.

RE – Judaism

Judaism	The religion of the Jewish people.
Torah	The special book of the Jewish faith.
Menorah	A 7 branched candle holder used in Jewish worship.
Rabbi	A teacher of the Torah in Judaism.
Synagogue	The place of worship for those following the Jewish faith.
Shabbat	The Jewish day of rest and celebration.
Tallit	Jewish prayer shawl.
Kippah	A head covering worn by Jewish men.



Sticky Knowledge:

Some special Jewish stories are the same as Christian special stories.

Jewish people celebrate Shabbat to observe a day of rest to remember that God rested on the 7th day after he made the world.

Shabbat begins at sunset on a Friday and ends at sunset on the Saturday. This time is for family and to attend services at the synagogue.

Science – Living things and their habitats

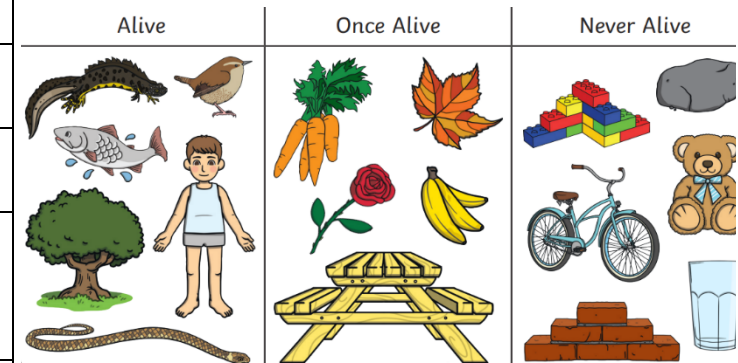

living	Animals and plants are living things. Living things need to have their basic needs met to survive.
alive	Something that is living and surviving.
dead	Something that is not living.
habitat	The natural place in which something lives. A habitat provides living things with everything they need to survive.
adapt	To make (something) suitable for a new use or purpose.



Sticky Knowledge:

Dry leaves on the ground are dead, but they were once part of a living tree.

Bones were once part of a living animal that now is dead.

Anything manmade has never been alive.

Animals and plants adapt to their habitats.

Animals live in habitats where they can get food.
