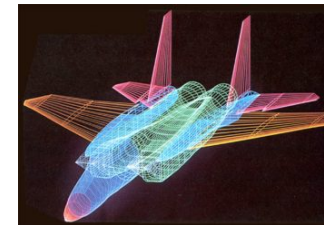
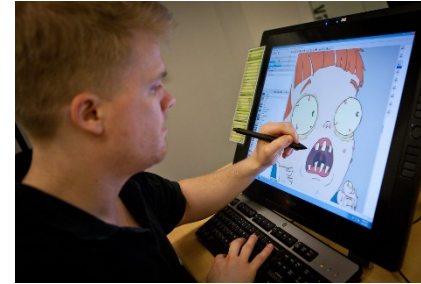

History – Schools – Past and Present

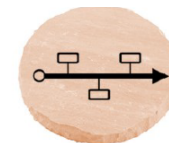
timeline	A way of showing events in time in the correct order.

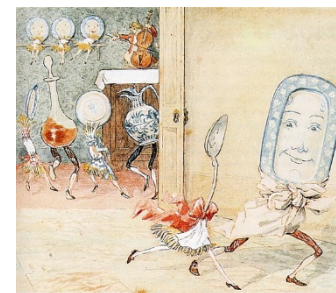


Sticky Knowledge:

Who is Jewish and what do they believe?

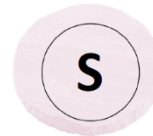
Synagogue	The place of worship for those following the Jewish faith.
Torah Scrolls	The special book of the Jewish faith.
Menorah	A 7 branched candle holder used in Jewish worship.
Hebrew	The language of the Jewish people.
Chanukah	Also known as Hanukkah, is a Jewish holiday that lasts for eight nights and usually occurs in December. It is also known as the Festival of Lights.
Yad	This is a pointer used with the Torah Scrolls so they do not touch the scrolls.

Jewish people remember and celebrate the story of Moses leading the people from Egypt at Passover.

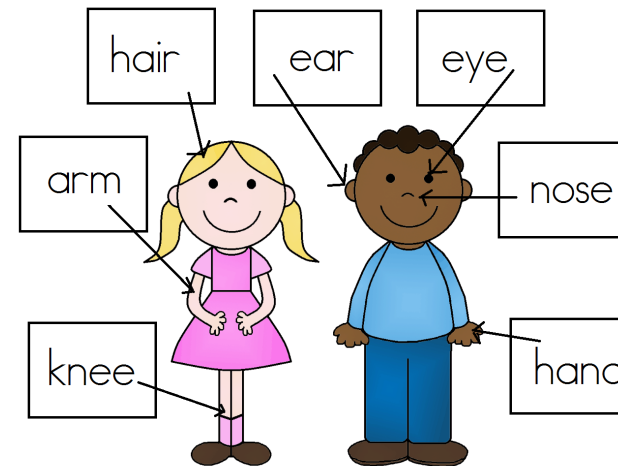

body parts	The different parts of the human body.
knee	The joint in the middle part of the human leg.
chest	The upper front part of the human body.
thigh	The part of a human leg between the hip and the knee.
purpose	The reason for something.
senses	A human has 5 senses, sight, smell, hearing, taste and touch.



Sticky Knowledge:

Humans need food as a source of energy, clean water, air (oxygen) to breathe and a shelter that is warm and safe to survive.

The human body is made up of many parts.

The eyes, ears, nose, tongue, and skin are the parts of the body associated with the five senses of sight, hearing, smell, taste, and touch.
