Made, done or chosen without a conscious decision.

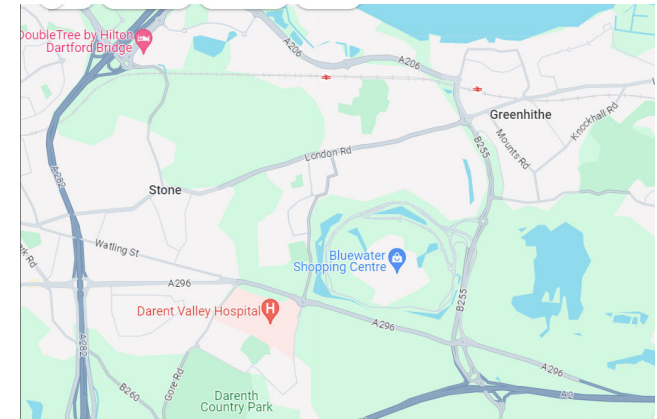
systematic

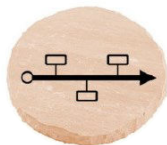

Sticky Knowledge
