






Sticky Knowledge

- Living things need food and water to survive.
- Insects have 6 legs and 3 body parts, spiders have eight legs and 2 body parts.
- Butterflies lay eggs which hatch into caterpillars. This is called a lifecycle.
- Spiders make webs to catch their own food.
- Worms like living in damp soil, they often come out after it has rained.
- When you pick up a minibeast remember to be very gentle & respectful as they are living creatures.

insect- a small creature that has 6 legs and 3 parts to their body.

damp- slightly wet.

habitat- the place that an animal or plant lives in.

lifecycle- how a living thing changes and grows.


minibeast- a small animal with no spine.
