<b>Ask a Question</b> Little Red Riding Hood stopped to talk to the Big Bad wolf in the woods, do you think that was a good idea? Talk to your grownup about what she should have done.	<b>DT</b> Using some boxes or old cardboard, could you design and build a new chair for Baby Bear? Test it out with one of your teddies.	<b>Literacy</b> Write down a list of questions that you could ask Goldilocks. <b>Can you....</b> Draw a picture of a new house that the three little pigs lived in happily together?	<b>Cooking</b> Decorate some biscuits or cakes. You could take some pictures to show the rest of the class.	<b>Investigate</b> Draw and label some household objects and find out which materials they are made of.	<b>Research</b> With help from an adult use the internet to research about Traditional tales around the world.
<b>Maths</b> Ask your grownup to hide numbers 1-20 around the house and then you have to find them. Once you have can you put them in order from the smallest to the largest?	<b>Creative</b> Make a mask of a character from a story – be careful to think about how the character is feeling.	<b>Music</b> Make up a song/rap/poem about a traditional tale. (see <i>Roald Dahl's revolting Rhymes</i> for ideas.)	<b>Visit...</b> Your local library to have a look at different traditional tales, borrow one and share it with your family or bring it into school.
