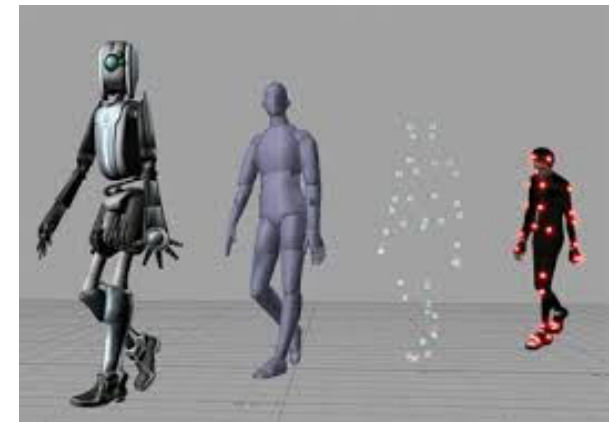

Key Vocabulary

Follower

The part that moves up and down (or follows) when a cam turns.

Cam shaft

Is a rod or shaft that holds one or more cams. When it turns, the cams move parts like followers up and down.

Reciprocating motion

A movement that goes back and forth in a straight line, like a saw or a pump.

Rotary motion

A movement that goes round and round, like a wheel turning.

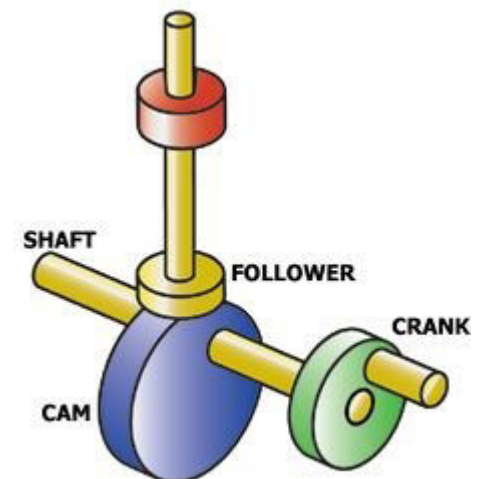
Oscillating motion

A movement that swings from side to side,

Sticky Knowledge

A cam is a rotating part that changes rotary motion into up-and-down (reciprocating) motion." *This helps us understand how moving parts in machines and toys can be controlled.*

Different cam shapes (like egg, snail, or pear) create different types of movement in the follower.

Key Vocabulary

Power

The ability to control or influence people or things. It can also mean having the strength to do something.

Villain

A bad character in a story or a person who does wrong or harms others. Villains are often the enemies of the hero.

Magna Carta

A famous document signed in 1215 in England. It limited the power of the king and gave people certain rights.

Excommunicating

The act of officially excluding someone from a group, especially the Christian Church, because of their actions or beliefs.

Democratic

A way of governing where people vote and have a say in the decisions that affect them, such as in a democracy.

Constitution

A set of rules or laws that explain how a country or organization is run and what everyone's rights and responsibilities are.

Sticky Knowledge

King John signed the Magna Carta in 1215.

The Magna Carta is the basis of democracy in the UK.

The Magna Carta ensured that the monarchy were subject to the law and not above it.

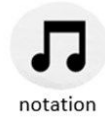

Key Vocabulary

Verse

The part of a song or poem that usually has different words each time but keeps the same tune or rhythm.

Chorus

The repeating part of a song that usually comes after each verse. It's often the catchy bit everyone remembers!

Composition

A piece of music, writing, or art that someone has created. In music, it means a piece someone has written.

Arrangement

In music, it's how a song is put together, including which instruments play, and in what order the parts go.

Bridge

A different-sounding section in a song that connects two parts (like verse and chorus). It adds variety before returning to the main tune.

Contrast

Sticky Knowledge

A bridge is a contrasting section that prepares for the return of the original section.

A staff is a set of five horizontal lines used in music to show where notes go. It helps musicians read and play music correctly.

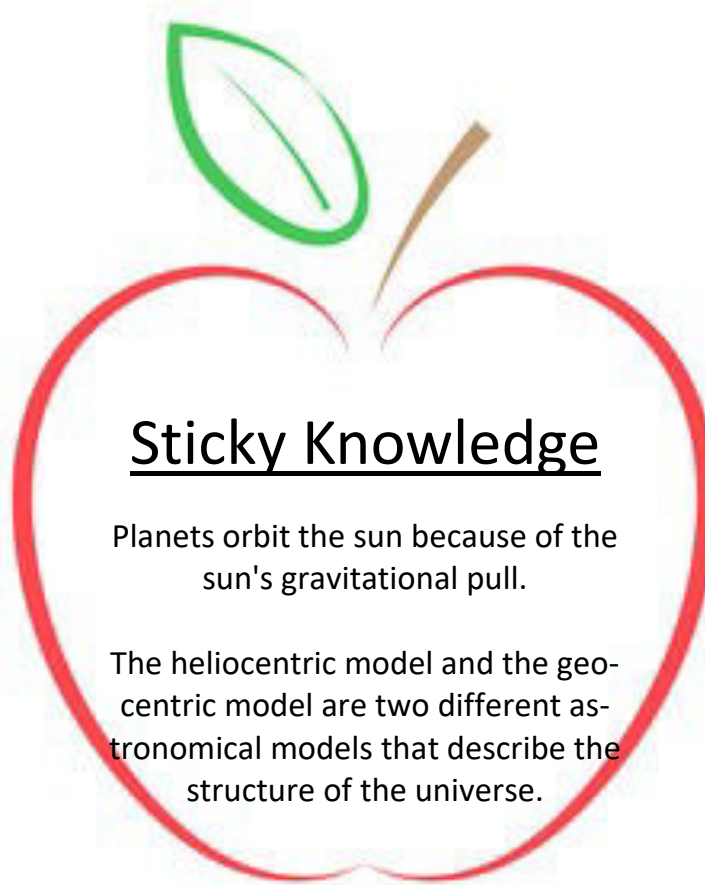
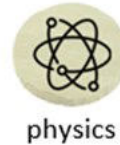
Something that orbits a planet. It can be natural or manmade.

Geocentric model

The old idea that the Earth is at the centre of the universe and that the Sun, Moon, and planets all move around it.

Heliocentric model

Is the idea that the Sun is at the centre of the Solar System, and the Earth and other planets



Sticky Knowledge

Planets orbit the sun because of the sun's gravitational pull.

The heliocentric model and the geocentric model are two different astronomical models that describe the structure of the universe.
