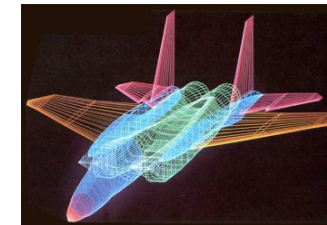
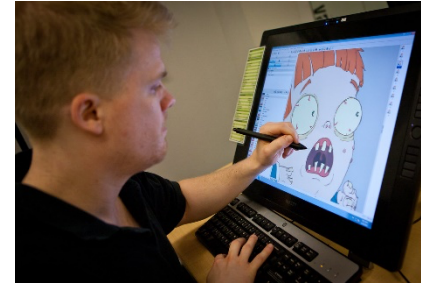

changes	To make something different.
design	To plan how something will be built or carried out.
programming	To give a computer instructions to solve a problem.
imaginative	To invent or be creative.
animation	The use of a computer to create moving images.
sprites	Animated 2D moving characters like Sonic or Mario.



Sticky knowledge:

- Programming (giving instructions to a computer) is used to create a computing animation.
- Debugging is recognising a problem and solving the problem.

house	A building for a human to live in.
tool	A handheld device that makes changes.
suitable	Right or appropriate for a person or purpose.
model	A miniture version of something.
rigid	Unable to bend, not flexible.
specification	A detailed description of the design and materials used.



Sticky Knowledge

- Stronger, more rigid materials are best to make a model house.
- Scissors, sellotape, glue and masking tape are some of the tools you may need when building a model house.

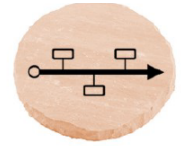
History – Schools – Past and Present

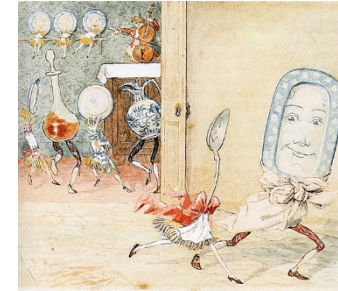


Sticky Knowledge:

Music – Nursery Rhymes

nursery rhyme	A short song or story for children.
pattern	The beat, rhythm or melody that repeats in a piece of music.
innovate	To make changes to something.
blend	The mixing of different sounds or instruments.
echo	To repeat a phrase or sentence in a song.
rhythm	The length of time between each beat.

Sticky Knowledge:

Who is Jewish and what do they believe?

Synagogue	The place of worship for those following the Jewish faith.
Torah Scrolls	The special book of the Jewish faith.
Menorah	A 7 branched candle holder used in Jewish worship.
Hebrew	The language of the Jewish people.
Chanukah	Also known as Hanukkah, is a Jewish holiday that lasts for eight nights and usually occurs in December. It is also known as the Festival of Lights.
Yad	This is a pointer used with the Torah Scrolls so they do not touch the scrolls.

Sticky Knowledge:

- Hanukkah (Chanukah) is the Jewish eight-day, wintertime 'festival of lights', which is celebrated with a nightly menorah lighting, special prayers and foods.

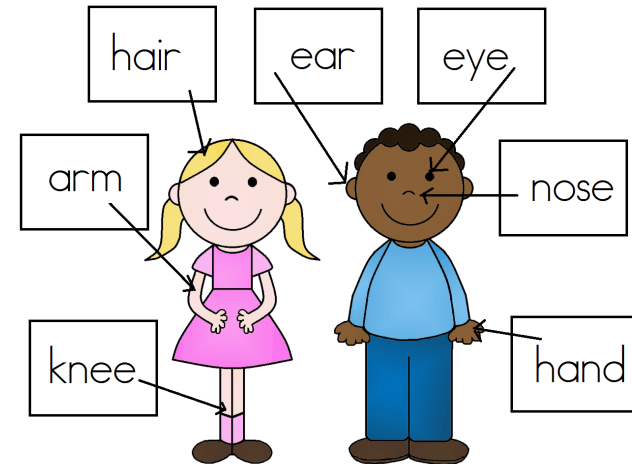

body parts	The different parts of the human body.
exercise	Any physical activity that keeps the body healthy, strengthens muscles and bones and improves wellbeing.
diet	The food and drink that we usually eat.
survive	To live through something.
purpose	The reason for something.
senses	A human has 5 senses, sight, smell, hearing, taste and touch.



Sticky Knowledge:

- Humans need food as a source of energy, clean water, air (oxygen) to breathe and a shelter that is warm and safe to survive.
- The human body is made up of many parts.
- The eyes, ears, nose, tongue, and skin are the parts of the body associated with the five senses of sight, hearing, smell, taste, and touch.
